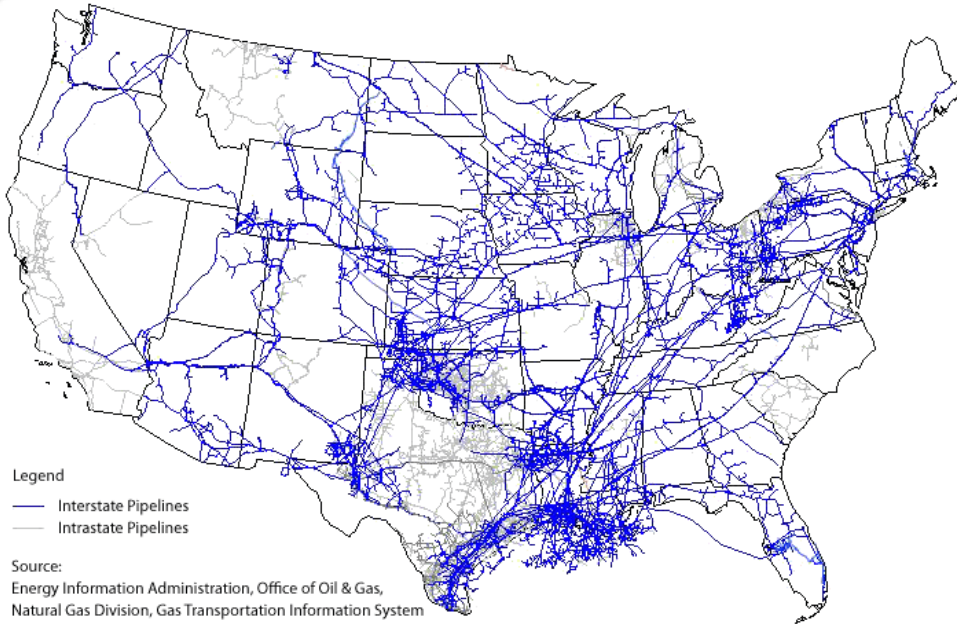


Where Your Natural Gas Comes From



U.S. natural gas transmission pipelines connect production regions, storage facilities, and local distribution systems across the country.

Some of the natural gas used in New Jersey is produced far from the state and must move through interstate pipelines before it reaches local delivery systems.



From Production to Delivery

The path natural gas takes to reach you and what South Jersey Industries (SJI) does at each step



Sourced

Natural gas is sourced across the country to bring to New Jersey homes and businesses.

SJI purchases natural gas from a supplier and charges customers the same price with no markup.



Transported

Natural gas travels through large interstate pipelines to reach New Jersey.

SJI secures space on pipelines to ensure gas is available, especially during severe weather and peak demand.



Delivered

Natural gas is delivered through more than 19,000 miles of pipeline to homes and businesses.

SJI operates and maintains an extensive pipeline system in order to deliver safe, reliable service every day.
